When Is A Lamb Chop More Than A Lamb Chop?

Let's take a look at a 125 lb. market ready lamb:



Average dressing percent for lambs (shorn): 55% 125 lbs. x 55% = 69 lbs. carcass
Average loss from cutting and trimming: 25% 64 lbs. x 75% = 52 lbs. of retail cuts

Of that 52 lbs. of retail cuts, approx. 15 lbs. comes from the leg, 8 lbs. from loin, 6 lbs. from rib, 13 lbs. from shoulder, and 10 lbs. from miscellaneous

Average Price for Leg/Loin/Rib: \$11.50/lb

Average Price for Shoulder/Misc.: \$6.50/lb

Total Cost of Leg, Loin and Rib: 29 lbs. x \$11.50/lb. = \$333.50 Total Cost of Shoulder and Miscellaneous: 23 lbs. x \$6.50/lb. = \$149.00

Total Cost of Meat from One Lamb at Grocery Store: \$483.50

If you purchased that same 125 lb. lamb at a 4-H/FFA Livestock Show and Sale:

Cost to purchase lamb: 125 lbs. x \$4.00/lb = \$500.00 Cost to have the lamb processed: \$45.00 (approximately)

Total Cost of Meat from One Lamb Through 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale: \$545.00

Added Value of A 4-H/FFA Raised Lamb

- √ Buy locally
- √ Know where and how your food was raised
- √ Meat comes from a single animal
- √ Can be counted as a charitable contribution for taxes
