Overview

- The science of apple growing is called pomology.
- It takes the energy from 50 leaves to produce one apple.
- The largest apple picked weighed three pounds.
- Apples have five seed pockets or carpels. Each pocket contains seeds. The number of seeds per carpel is determined by the vigor and health of the plant.

Apples are grown in all 50 states, but commercially in 36 2,500 varieties of apples are grown in the United States, 7,500 varieties world wide

100 varieties of apples are grown commercially in the United States.
