planted in the United
States is sweet corn

Overview

- There is one silk for every kernel that grows in an ear of corn.
- A bushel of corn is 56 pounds, about the weight of a large bag of dog food.
- The number of kernels per ear can vary from 500 to about 1,200, but a typical ear would have 800 kernels in 16 rows.

Production

Corn is grown in every continent except
Antarctica.

About a third of America's corn crop is used for feeding cattle, hogs, and poultry in the U.S.

Just over a third of the corn crop is used to make ethanol.


