POULTRY CLASSIFICATIONS

Poultry class definitions are based on the sex and age of the bird when harvested.

Immature chicken less than five weeks old, of either sex, with a ready-to-cook carcass weight of two pounds or less.

Cornish Game Hen

Broiler or Fryer

Chicken less than 13 weeks old, of either sex, that is tender-meated with soft, pliable, smooth-textured skin and flexible breastbone cartilage.

Young chicken less than 12 weeks old, of either sex, with a ready-to-cook carcass weight of 5.5 pounds or more, that is tender-meated with soft, pliable, smooth-textured skin and breastbone cartilage that is somewhat less flexible than that of a broiler or fryer.

Roaster or Roasting

Capon

A surgically neutered male chicken younger than 8 months old that is tender-meated with soft, pliable, smoothtextured skin.

Immature turkey younger than 16 weeks old of either sex, that is tender-meated with soft, pliable, smooth-textured skin, and flexible breastbone cartilage. Fryer-Roasting Turkey
