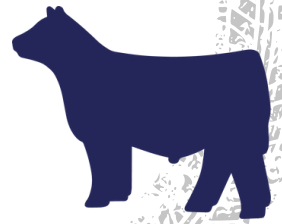
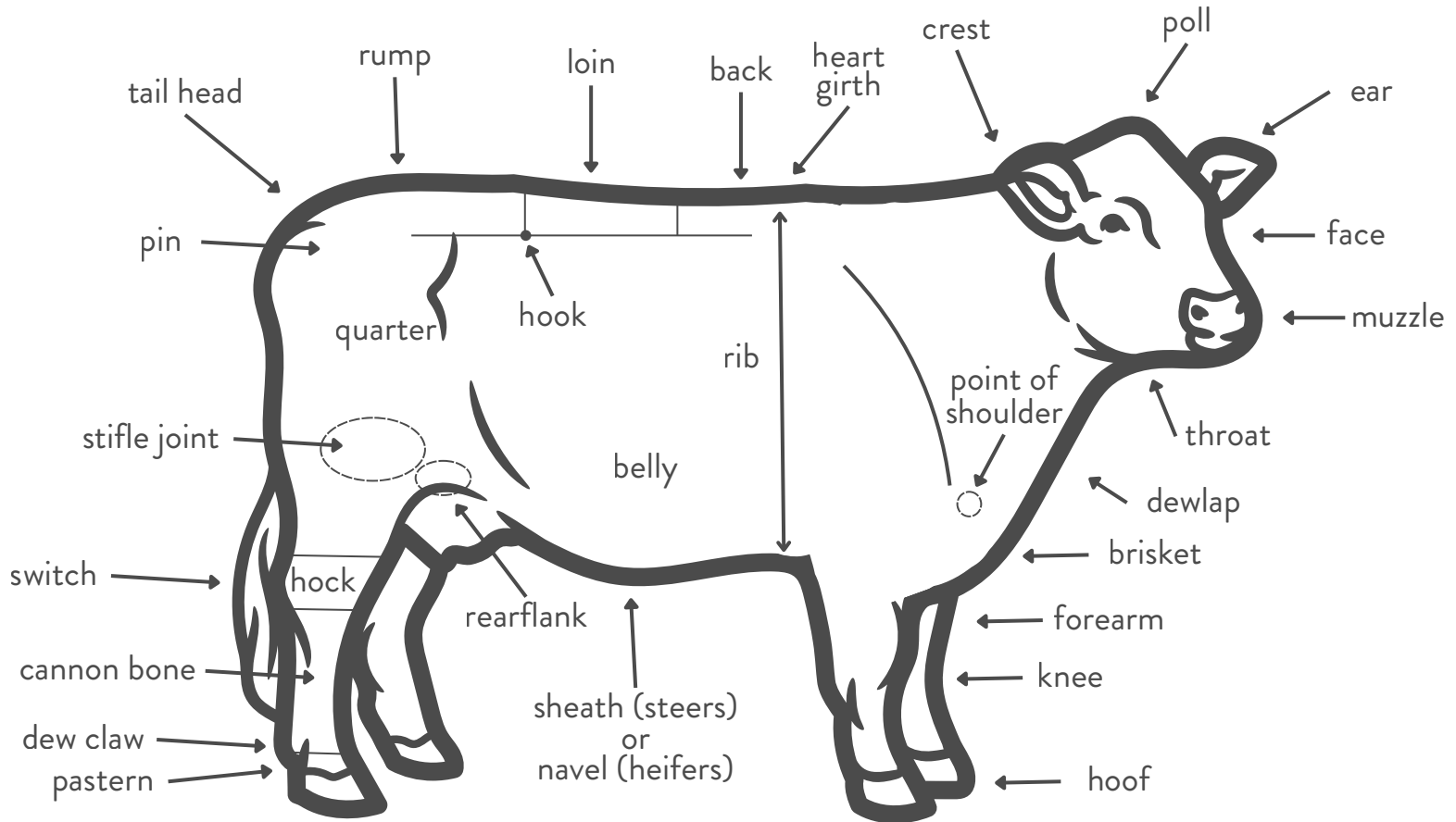




ANATOMY OF A STEER

Fun Facts:

- **Poll Position:** The poll is the area right between a steer's ears, at the top of the head. It's an important reference point for identifying head shape and is often used when haltering or showing cattle.
- **Brisket Power:** The brisket, located between the front legs, is a key muscle group that supports the animal's weight and is also a popular beef cut.
- **Hooks and Pins:** These are bony landmarks on the steer's hip and rump. They help judges evaluate body structure and muscling during livestock shows.
