

Meeting the Challenges of Global Changes and Generational Shifts

s the days grow shorter leading up to the winter holidays, it is a time of great satisfaction at Farm Credit of the Virginias as we continued throughout 2019 to serve our customers and strengthen the operations of your cooperative.

Financially, we are ahead of budget projections for the year. Our operating expenses are below budget, primarily because of unfilled staff positions as we search diligently for the right people to support our mission. Our provision for loan losses is also lower than expected thanks to the careful financial planning of our customers.

As we all know, agriculture has been under tremendous strain in recent years, particularly the dairy sector. Many of our producers have been operating at a loss while milk prices remained woefully low for an extended period of time. Overall, our customers have done an admirable job weathering this arduous cycle. With the recent

uptick in price, I have hope that this means there are better days ahead.

Challenges continue, of course, as challenges always do in an industry as diversified as agriculture. Our beef customers are effectively treading water as price volatility persists. There is hope that a trade agreement with Japan will increase beef exports and thus help this beset sector. Trade negotiations continue with China as well, and we can hope for an uptick in exports such as soybeans and a return to more stable commodity prices.

These global changes are accompanied by a generational shift within agriculture and at Farm Credit. We are in a time of extensive hiring of the younger generation as the more tenured generation moves into retirement. Our focus is on finding individuals with the professional skills each position requires, as well as a customer-focused mindset and a genuine connection to our mission of serving agriculture and rural communities.

We operate in a unique space, and seek always to find individuals who demonstrate commitment and hard work, as well as compassion and appreciation. We're also committed to investing the resources needed to ensure that those we do hire learn and grow quickly, so they are able to support our customers as they embrace changes in technology that also carry changes in financial needs.

A similar generational transition is happening in many of our customers' operations as well. More and more, we are seeing multiple generations working on the farm, sometimes as many as four generations working together to strengthen and grow their operations. While the senior generation may take a less active role, their experience and insight are invaluable. Younger generations bring new ideas and energy that also contribute greatly to a farm's ongoing success. We recognize that these changes also affect

how we operate and how we interact with our customers. We are committed to continuing to evolve alongside our customer-owners as we have for more than a century.

In 2020, we will be re-launching our "Grow Your Knowledge" program to provide an overview of agricultural resources, practices and opportunities for youth, those who are entering into agriculture industry, or those looking for a new venture to add diversification to a current operation.

We, too, continue to ensure that our voice is heard in Congress. As you may remember, we participated in the July Fly-In organized by the Farm Credit Council. During which, we visited representatives for the territory we support and shared Farm Credit's message. We will continue to discuss important issues with both state and federal representatives. The Council has also developed an advocacy program to help Farm Credit customers communicate with their representatives to keep producers and rural residents top of mind when voting on related issues. We encourage all our customers to sign up for this program, which will distribute notifications and pre-written communications for you to send to your representatives when key measures are being discussed. As the holiday season draws near, I am, as always, filled with warmth and respect


Charles (Chuck) E. Horn, Jr. (incumbent)

Call to Serve

o you want to get more involved with your local Farm Credit cooperative? Well here's your chance! Each year, Farm Credit of the Virginias (FCV) holds elections for its Board of Directors and Nominating Committee. As you probably noticed, the results of the recent elections are presented in this issue of the Leader.

Annually, FCV holds elections for director positions. The Board of Directors is responsible for the oversight and conduct of the Association's affairs. The Board determines the strategic direction for the Association, formulates policies, provides supervision, and promotes the Association's welfare. Directors serve a four-year term. In 2020, four director seats will be up for election. Potential director candidates will be selected from the following counties:

Seat 1 — Paul M. House, incumbent director: Arlington, Fairfax, Fauquier, Loudoun, Prince William, and Stafford Counties, VA.

Seat 3 — Kevin C. Craun, incumbent director: Rockingham County, VA.

Seat 7 — Barry W. Shelor, incumbent director: Floyd, Franklin, Henry, Montgomery and Patrick Counties, VA.

Seat 8 — Alfred W. Stephens, Jr., incumbent director: Bland, Carroll, Giles, Grayson, Pulaski, Smyth, Tazewell and Wythe Counties, VA.

Also annually, members are elected to serve on the Nominating Committee. This committee is responsible for selecting a slate of candidates for the next year's election. The Nominating Committee that is elected in 2020 will be looking at director candidates for 2021. Nominating Committee members serve a one-year term. In 2020, potential nominating committee candidates will be selected from the following counties:

Overcoming the Challenge of Transitions

County Line Construction, County Line Materials & Rolling "K" Farms

tarted a stone's throw from the Rockingham-Augusta county line and now located right next door to the Harrisonburg branch office sits County Line Construction and County Line Materials, two businesses owned by Virginia natives, Sherman and Amy Knicely. Along with these two thriving businesses, they also co-own a poultry and beef cattle operation with Sherman's brother Glenn. The farm operation includes two George's pullet rearing houses and 160 brood cows, run on farms located in both Virginia and West Virginia. With several successful operations that continue to grow, they have been preparing for the future of the legacies they have built.

Having been involved in building and construction for most of his life, Sherman decided to form County Line Construction in 1998 and later, County Line Materials in 2006. One car, a handful of tools and a single employee was all they had starting out. At

that time, he preferred not to use modern conveniences. However, looking around the County Line warehouse today, you might never realize that both the construction and the materials business once did all their bookkeeping with pen and paper, no computers or modern technologies.

Even payroll was completed with carbon paper and a basic calculator. "It was a big deal. Payroll was Thursday nights. Sherman would work a full day of construction starting at 5:30 am and then come home and do payroll until nearly midnight," Amy remembers. Even though it was difficult, it was a fond memory for the couple. "We look back and say those were the good days, they really were," she continued.

When Sherman made the call to modernize and bring technology into the construction and materials businesses, things took off. "It was a difficult decision, not only because of my resistance to change, but because of the substantial investment as well.

But in doing so, it has grown the businesses significantly," he said.

County Line Construction and County Line Materials now operate out of a large warehouse with several supplemental buildings and many pieces of large equipment. They have increased to nearly 40 employees on the construction side and 15 on the materials side. County Line has grown to be considered a premier agricultural builder by the community, and Sherman places all the credit with his employees and partnerships.

His family's dedication to the farm and his partnership with his brother, Glenn, have been crucial to their success, and worked out better than he could have imagined. With their support, he has been able to focus on building his construction and materials businesses. Everyone contributes and management has evolved over time. Glenn and Sherman's eldest son, Layne, run the farm now. Another one of the strongest decisions he made was

hiring Jeff Kiracofe, who has helped Sherman modernize the companies.

"When Jeff came on, that's when things with County Line really went to another level. He helped to put all the technology in place and looked at all the data," Sherman said.

The combination of young and older employees in his workforce has provided a symphony of talent in his organizations. "You've got 20 year olds and 40 to 50 year olds coming together and it produces something incredible," Sherman says. The younger folks have provided insight into the newer technologies and have fresh ideas. The older folks are able to contribute generational knowledge and experience, only gained from years working in the field. As the old saying goes, if you fail to plan, you can plan to fail, so Sherman is already putting a plan in place for the success of his companies, long after he's gone.

While Sherman would love to see his children take over the construction and materials businesses, they have shown greater interest in continuing the farm. Not wanting to force any of their children into a life they did not desire, he and Amy thoughtfully chose four successors to offer co-ownership to. "Some of these guys have 20 years with the business, and are genuinely interested," he says. "My goal is to help any one of these young people who are willing to put forth an effort to succeed," Sherman continued.

Many times businesses fail on the transition from hammer-in-hand to the delegating of responsibilities, but County Line has remained strong. An aspect that Sherman is passionate about is training to the best of his ability, and then being able to step back and allow the next person to take the reins. Additionally, while failing at something might sound like a negative outcome, Sherman insists that it simply means his people are being creative and trying new ideas, which is the only way you can move forward.

Great people are not Sherman's only key to success. Diversifying his operations, even if



it was not the original intention, has provided an unexpected area for growth. "When the economy got bad, we started saying 'yes' to everything, which forced us to diversify and take on projects we normally would not have," Sherman noted. His plans for the future are to continue diversifying, with both the businesses and the farm.


Now having been a customer-owner for over 20 years, Sherman reflects on his relationship with Farm Credit. Throughout his journey, his loan officers have been there not only to help him in the lending process, but also to make the best decisions possible for his businesses. Sherman recalls conversations he has had with his loan officers. "'Are you

sure that you know what you're doing here? Does this make sense?' You need somebody to challenge you," he says.

As for some words of wisdom, the family says, "We have been richly blessed. We are grateful to God, our families and the community for their continued support." Sherman summarized the pivotal lessons he has learned over the years, "Don't be afraid to try something, or even of failing. Ask questions. Diversify as soon as you possibly can. Always be open to new ideas. Surround yourself with and/or hire people who have good character and are smarter than you. Listen to the young people; they have answers we need to hear as well."

rad Howard was 72 years old when the idea was planted through faith that would eventually become his legacy. At the time, Brad had been facing depression, loneliness, and a lack of purpose. He couldn't help but think, "I have everything I've ever wanted; a nice house, mortgage paid, land, all the equipment I could ever need, you name it. I've accomplished all that I've set out to do in my life, why do I feel so down?"

One January morning, after some thought and a healthy dose of prayer, Brad arose from his bed before daylight, put his feet on the floor,




and was cured of his sadness. Brad recalls eating breakfast quickly, and heading outside to begin planning. He had undertaken a host of large projects around his property in the past, but none of this magnitude.

Brad walked to the edge of his 46-acre farm nearest the road, facing his jersey cow pasture and the horse barn he had designed and built behind it, and decided that was to be the spot for his latest and largest undertaking, a log cabin to serve as a retreat for wounded veterans and their families.

The cabin would become a place of healing for soldiers, whether they faced mental and/or physical limitations post-deployment, or needed a quiet place to aid in their transition back to civilian life. Soldiers could stay for a long-weekend or more, enjoy the quiet atmosphere to reflect on their service, and take in the calmness of the panoramic mountain views, sweeping trails, docile livestock, and Lynch River access.

Brad began pushing down trees the same day the idea came to him. A few weeks into the build, Brad's progress halted. He found himself lacking the resources to bring his vision to life. Brad's next course of action was visiting his Loan Officer, Kim Love, to share his plans and secure financing for his lofty goals. Kim worked with Brad for two months to improve his credit worthiness and secure the funds to make his ambitious pipe dream a reality.



18-months after Kim signed off on the check that put Brad's plans into action, the cabin was completed. There, at the front of his Albermerle County property, lies a beautiful, dark-stained log-cabin, pretty enough to grace the cover of a Southern Living magazine, inside and out, with a welcome sign that reads, Farm View Cabin. The cabin is handicap accessible and furnished by Brad himself, with décor that pays homage to his patriotism and rural lifestyle.

The build was no small feat, but a labor of love for Brad and the folks that helped him make it happen. During the build and furnishing process, many people were interested in supporting Brad and his vision for Farm View Cabin, from the veteran that assumed much of the heavy lifting on the construction, to the companies that issued discounts once they learned the cabin's purpose, including Acme Stoves - Charlottesville, Sunbelt Rentals, and Airflow Heating Systems.

Brad has long been sympathetic to the needs of veterans. He shared, "During the Vietnam War, I had a draft card, but they wouldn't take me because I was married and had a child. They couldn't afford to bring me on. I went to all the different branches to try and sign up, but nobody would take me. I was not able to go to the Vietnam War and I've always had kind of a special spot in my heart for those who went to Vietnam and I know some of them. I lost some friends and so I've always felt it was something I should do."

He continued, "Soldiers give so much for this country. I sit in my living room and I don't have to worry about somebody knocking on the door. We live in a free country because of all the brave soldiers. This is my tribute to them."



The possibilities are endless for the 14-acre parcel and cabin that Brad has deemed his legacy. Brad is in talks with the Wounded Warrior Project to secure contacts that could make use of the cabin. He is working with Living Free, a ministry devoted to helping military families recover as a unit and cope with the transition to civilian life. Additionally, Brad is in talks with Project Healing Waters, an organization dedicated to the physical and emotional rehabilitation of veterans through fly fishing and associated activities. The horse barn behind the cabin lends way for therapeutic riding opportunities as well.

The cabin was completed in October of 2019, and the first veteran is slated to occupy the cabin at the end of December. Brad is patiently waiting by the phone for both veterans and sponsors to sign-up. He shared, "We are in the infant stages, but we are ready to roll. Currently, as I recoup my construction costs, we're asking sponsors to pay a fee for the veteran's stay. I think it would be an awesome thing if somebody could put his or her name on a list and a soldier could contact them and they could have some interaction between the two of them, enjoying the property or just chit-chatting. I'd like to get a large list going of sponsors - I think the sponsorship and interaction is a big part of it."

he Farm Credit Knowledge Center was designed to share information and knowledge with producers to help them be more efficient, effective, profitable and successful. Since our start, we have held numerous workshops and educational opportunities for producers across the footprint, in many different industries. One of the longest running and most comprehensive of these continues to be our Ag Biz Planner Program. This program, held in partnership with Farm Credit University, is now in its ninth year. It has helped to build a foundation of knowledge about business planning, financial management, farm management and agriculture economics for more than 60 farm and agribusiness operations during that time. As with anything though, you get out what you put into it. The knowledge has been acquired, and a strong foundation laid with a business plan, but it is up to each individual what they do with that information.

So how have past participants applied the knowledge gained?

"Currently, I manage Hillcrest Farm (family operation) that consists of beef cattle, crops, and timber. Since participating in Ag Biz I review my business plan often (at least yearly, sometimes every six months) and pay more attention to financial statements (monthly expenses and income are updated and this information generates spreadsheet to evaluate each month). The materials have allowed me to be better prepared for future decisions. I have found I am more pragmatic with decisions by incorporating looking not only at current conditions but forecasting for the future as well as evaluating efficiencies, etc."

What insights and lessons did they gain from participating in the Ag Biz Planner program?

"I am in rapid expansion mode and I am still using the original spreadsheet I created while taking the class. It allows me to manage my expenses on a monthly basis. Also, I can foresee future income and adjust it based on price sensitivities in the rapidly changing markets. The class taught me to sit down and create a thorough spreadsheet, where I am planning ahead in detail so things are not missed in the future."

"I used the material I learned in the Ag Biz Planner program to plan for my herd expansion. I prepared my documents, a current financial statement, projected cash flow, a balance sheet and a good business plan, before going to visit my lender. I presented the lender with a folder of the farm history and current operation along with my papers about my current finances and future plans. The information I learned in the program helped me be better prepared to meet with lenders and ultimately helped me secure a loan for my herd expansion."

Was it worth it?


"Creating the business plan as part of the Ag Biz Planner class was an eye opener. I have used the business plan, and continue to use the business plan, to see if we are improving our business situation and also to determine where to focus our efforts in terms of expansion and marketing. It has helped take the emotion out of some of our business decisions. It is hard to set forth a valid argument as to why we should continue doing something when the data clearly doesn't support that approach anymore. It has also been very valuable in terms of helping us focus our attention instead of trying to do everything at once. We are still selling pasture raised lamb and pork, but we have expanded our Goat's Milk soap line to include lotions, face creams and lip balms."








Garland Comer & Lazy C Farms:

From Small Family Farm to Large Growing Operation



I currently farm 280 acres of tobacco, 550 acres of soybeans, 120 acres of corn, 200 acres of wheat, and 10 acres of other crops.

How has your farm grown since you started?

I started with 11 acres of tobacco and 15 acres of wheat the first year. In 16 years, I've grown it to the current size. I started with old, worn out equipment and have slowly added a lot of new equipment. The efficiency has come a long way. As an example, the rule of thumb is 10 acres per worker and in tobacco we are at 280 acres with 16 guys that is all hand harvested.




How did you know you wanted to farm?

I actually never imagined I would farm. I had always helped my grandpa on the farm, and after high school, I took over the operation. Then, one day the financial aspect clicked with me and I knew I could make it work.

What was the process like taking the farm over from your grandfather?

Honestly, it was easy. He was ready to be done and just enjoy being retired. We prepared for what was coming for a couple of years before I took over. I followed his every move, day in and day out. Then all of the sudden, he started taking more "sick and vacation" days or just not showing up! I think we both knew I was ready.



Was taking over the operation something that your grandfather always wanted for you?

Yes, he said he could see it in me at an early age, but he wanted me to decide and want it myself. He knew it was not something you can force and have success.

What have been your keys to success?

A lot of hard work, networking, marketing Lazy C Farms Inc., and staying ahead and in front of issues that come up.

What has been your greatest accomplishment?



all the pieces together ourselves. My goal is to continue to improve the operation and stay open to any areas where we can grow, while maintaining what we have.

How would you describe your relationship with Farm Credit?

Great! I can call them with anything or any question and they are right on it. They are very open, easy to talk to, understanding, and I have made many great lifelong friendships!

What advice would you give to young, beginning or small farmers?

My advice would be never back down from something you think you can handle, and jump in with both feet! ∞





Farm Credit is known for building relationships with its customers, but it goes further than that. The Farm Credit System was established by Congress more than 100 years ago, and the directors and employees of Farm Credit understand the importance of sharing the Farm Credit story with those key members. Relationships are built by visiting and meeting with representatives in Washington, D.C. and the states within our territory, making trips to locations they are visiting and participating in events where we can share our story.

ver the past several years, the United States, Mexico, and Canada have been negotiating the USMCA (US, Mexico, Canada Agreement) to replace the previous NAFTA (North American Free Trade Agreement) and enter into a new round of trade agreements between the three neighboring countries. In October 2018, the three countries reached an agreement, setting up a process for approval across all three nations. The agreement reached between the U.S., Mexico and Canada builds on previously-developed market opportunities and provides additional trade advancements for Ag industries like dairy and poultry. US Agriculture groups have been almost entirely united in urging Congress to approve the trade deal and Farm Credit joined close to 1,000 agriculture industry organizations urging passage of the USMCA. We continue to work with our legislators on both sides of the aisle to highlight the importance of trade for agriculture and our rural communities. After many months of additional discussions and negotiations, a vote in Congress may come before the end of 2019.

Remember, as a customer-member, you can join Farm Credit's advocacy team-just visit https://farmcredit.com/takeaction and sign up for the action alert system. Once you are signed up, Farm Credit will contact you via email and text message when it's time to contact Congress again regarding key legislation for agriculture and our rural communities, like passage of the USMCA.

While most people are focused on the 2020 elections, Virginia residents will know that November 2019 held key elections for all 140 members of the state legislature. As of election night, there were 23 new legislators elected, and the Democrats took control of the Virginia legislature in both the House and Senate for the first time since the 1990's. Throughout the winter of 2020, Farm Credit will be working with our partners in VA and WV legislatures on key policy issues like water quality, education, cooperative extension, broadband, crop protection, and agricultural development.

We have been thrilled to continue our outreach and education efforts with new members of Congress this fall! Through farm visits, input on legislative issues like Ag labor and trade, and assistance on testimony before congressional committees, we have enjoyed building valuable partnerships with our representatives in Washington!



Rep. Ben Cline (VA) spent several days this fall with farmers in Rockingham, Augusta, Rockbridge, Amherst, Bedford and Botetourt counties on farm tours hosted by Farm Credit of the Virginias and our partners at the Va. Farm Bureau and Va. Agribusiness Council.



Rep. Jennifer Wexton (VA) joined us for an informative day in western Loudoun County visiting a winery, a pasture beef and hog farm, and an equine facility, focusing on efforts to encourage the development of young and beginning farmers.

Farm Credit joined two listening sessions with US Secretary of Agriculture, Sonny Perdue, as he spent a day traveling across Virginia. The first event was a small-group discussion with Senator Warner and Sweetbriar College in Amherst exploring efforts to engage young people in agriculture. This was followed by a roundtable with Rep. Ben Cline in Weyers Cave where Secretary Perdue took questions from the audience of farmers and agribusinesses.


