

The name pumpkin originated from "pepon", the Greek work for "large melon"

Giant pumpkins can weigh over **1,000 lbs**. In fact, the largest pumpkin grown in North America weighed **2,528 lbs**. (as of 2018)

Pumpkins are, scientifically, a fruit

Over 1.6 billion pounds of pumpkins are grown on over 65, 900 acres in the U.S. each year, and 80% of those are available in October

Virginia has more than 200 commercial pumpkin growers that grow approximately 3,900 acres of wholesale pumpkins. West Virginia harvested 191 acres of pumpkins (in 2017)

Pumpkin can be used in many ways: pumpkin flowers are edible, the seeds can be roasted for a snack (in fact, Native Americans used pumpkin seeds for food and medicine) and pumpkins can also be used as feed for animals!
