U.S. Agriculture Facts (Virginia and West Virginia Too!)

There are 2.1 million farms in the U.S., and more than 98% of them are operated by families. In West Virginia, 95% farms are family-owned, and in Virginia, it is 90%.

Cattle and calves, corn and dairy products are the top 3 U.S. farm products. In Virginia, it is broilers, cattle and calves and turkeys and in West Virginia it is broilers, cattle and calves, and hay.

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Across all commodities, farmers and ranchers receive about 15 cents of every dollar spent on food at home and away from home. In 1980, they received 31 cents.

Across the U.S. more than 20% of all farmers are beginning farmers (in business less than 10 years) and 30% of farm operators are women. In Virginia, 17% of primary farm operators are female.

West Virginia ranks 10th for apple production, 12th for trout production and 14th for turkey production in the U.S. Virginia ranks 3rd for leaf to acco, and 8th for apples, grapes and peanuts.

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
